Canada Company works with DND and VAC to build momentum on Military Employment Transition

Montréal, October 28, 2014 – Almost a year after announcing its intent to hire 10,000 Canadian Armed Forces Veterans in 10 years, Canada Company's Military Employment Transition (MET) program is building momentum in transitioning military members to civilian careers.

Tomorrow, more than 30 national and provincial companies and educational institutions will gather in Montréal with one common goal—to hire transitioning Canadian Armed Forces members and Veterans. Fully supported by the Department of National Defence/Canadian Armed Forces and Veterans Affairs Canada, this exclusive Employer Coalition job fair is hosted by Canada Company as part of their MET Program. Veterans, reservists and current-serving members transitioning from full-time military duty to civilian careers will attend the job fair.

Additionally, the 10,000 Jobs Coalition, under Canada Company's MET Program has released its latest results, announcing that its members have hired more than 400 CAF members and Veterans in the first nine months of 2014. The Coalition, which has more than doubled in size over the past year to 116 employer partners, is working toward finding employment for 10,000 Veterans by 2023.

The Canada Company MET Coalition continues to grow and expand, welcoming new employers from across Canada to join the effort to hire transitioning CAF members and Veterans, and reinforcing relationships with the Department of National Defence, the CAF, and Veterans Affairs Canada.
